## **Student Rights**

Students facing disciplinary action have rights that are protected by the College throughout the disciplinary process. Additional information regarding the disciplinary process is available in the *Student Handbook*.

I understand that before formal charges are presented to me in a case where I may be suspended or expelled, I have the following rights:

- 1. To request to be accompanied by the advisor of my choice<sup>1</sup>;
- 2. To be informed of the nature of the allegation, charges, or reports brought against me;
- 3. I am not required to testify against myself;
- 4. To present testimony or witnesses with respect to the complaint;
- 5. To be notified of decisions reached regarding my case;
- 6. To appeal the decision to the Student Appeals and Grievance Committee.2
