What NOT to Bring

Animals / Pets (of any kind)

Expensive clothing or jewelry

Family heirlooms

Important documents

Halogen lamps

Incenses, candles or heat-light-bulb wax/oil burners

Tasers, stun guns, mace spray

Weapons of any kind (guns, rifles, pistols, bow/arrow, etc.)

Pellet or Paint guns (of any kind)

Explosives of any kind

(including, but not limited to fireworks/firecrackers)

Hunting Knives

Knives with a blade longer than 4-inches

Space Heaters

Circulating Fans

BBQ grills / pits

Toasters or Toaster Ovens

Cooking burner hot-plates

Self-cooking crock pots

Hammocks

Clothing lines or clips

(Free laundry facilities in all residence halls)

Room Decorations

Student are welcome to bring items from home to hang on the walls to make their rooms more comfortable. If possible use wall adhesives for easy removal. Any hanging fixtures that permanently damage the walls; students will be accessed room damage fees for repair.

Climate

The Texas Panhandle (Clarendon, Texas) will experiences all four seasons. It is Home of the Plains meaning prairies and the wind blows most days. The winters are cold with snow so bring appropriate warm clothing and bedding. Although, you will see some of the most beautiful sunsets ever seen. This is the west, so bring those cowboy boots!

Pets

Pets of any kind (that includes goldfish) are not in allowed in college housing. Students participating in College sponsored programs, such as rodeo, which require students to bring their horses may do so, provided those animals are housed in the appropriate and designated areas. Only those animals necessary for participation in a specific program may be present on Campus.

Other pets are not allowed on Campus at any time. The fine for having a pet in the residence hall (first offense) is \$500.00, the second offense is \$750 fine, and disciplinary sanctions. Pets found on campus will be collected and sent to the local animal shelter.

Refrigerators

Students may have a refrigerator in their room, however no more than one refrigerator per room is allowed.

Refrigerators must be less than three cubic feet in size.

Open Flames

Open flames of any kind are not allowed in or around the residence halls. Students may not light candles, incense, or other item that holds an open flame. BBQ grills or pits (charcoal burning, propane gas, or otherwise) are not allowed in or around the residence halls. The safety of all residents is a significant concern, and any student found violating this policy will be subject to disciplinary action.

Tobacco

The use of tobacco products (including smokeless products) is prohibited in all Clarendon College facilities. Smoking and the use of other tobacco products is allowed only in areas outside of College buildings. Therefore, the smoking, chewing, and dipping of tobacco products are strictly prohibited in all places of formal instruction on Campus, including, but not limited to, classrooms, laboratories, lecture halls, libraries, activity centers, auditoriums, residence halls and residence hall rooms, and the cafeteria. Tobacco products are also prohibited in College vehicles. Students found using any form of tobacco in college facilities may be fined \$50 for each offense.

Extension Cords

All extension cords not specifically approved by the Dean of Students are prohibited. Acceptable cords include those containing an in-line fuse or circuit breaker. Questions pertaining to approved types of extension cords should be directed to the Director of Student Life.
