Course Description: It is meant to be a fun and enjoyable class while being able to practice and improve your skills at different disciplines in rodeo.

Statement of Purpose: Rodeo PE satisfies one of the two PE credits a student has to have for a Bachelors Degree.

Grading Policy: You are graded on Attendance and participation.

- For every 3 unexcused absences your grade will be lowered by one letter grade.

Class Conduct: I will show you the respect you deserve as a student. I in return, expect respectful behavior from you. Things that are expected.

- Be ready to go on time.
- Participate in what is going on.
- Zero abusive behavior to the livestock being used or to your own horses.

- Take turns helping (running the chute, pushing cattle up) what ever, depending on what we are doing. No one should just stay on their horse the whole time.

Horse Stall Rules:

- Keep trash picked up.
- Keep stalls cleaned.
- Every one should have their own wheelbarrow and manure rake. The tracker will not be used to clean the stalls.
- Your horse should be fed and watered every day.
- **Three times of being called out on any of the list above you will no longer get to board your horse at the school. No Exceptions.**
- Once a week (any given class) we will pick up trash at stalls and around arenas. So keep it clean and it won't take long.
