Course Description: Instruction in selecting, evaluating, and judging of beef cattle, sheep, swine, and horses. The course will include the judging of both breeding and market animals with decisions being supported by oral reasons.

Statement of Purpose: To utilize livestock evaluation in order to improve leadership qualities, communication skills, and decision making ability.

Course Objectives:

1. Evaluate market steers successfully.
2. Evaluate market lambs successfully.
3. Evaluate market swine successfully.
4. Evaluate breeding cattle successfully.
5. Evaluate breeding swine successfully.
6. Evaluate breeding sheep successfully.
7. Master the art of oral reasons as it relates to livestock judging.
8. Students will gain a practical understanding of the meats industry through meats judging.

Grades: Determined by participation. Students who choose to quit the judging team will be asked to drop the course. These courses are intended for program students only.
