DISABILITY STATEMENT

COURSE DESCRIPTION:

A detailed study of the knowledge of skills necessary to reach competency in the assessment and management of ill or injured patients in nontraditional populations

OBJECTIVES AND GOALS FOR THE COURSE:

At the completion of this course, the student will have demonstrated mastery of the course objectives listed at the beginning of each text chapter to demonstrate the ability to assess and manage patients from special populations. It is desired that course goals be accomplished to the extent that the student's final grade is not less than a grade of "C" *as evaluated by the program faculty*. A final Grade less than "C" will result in failure of the course.

GRADING:

Daily Grade	=	25% of final average
Major Exams (4)	=	50% of final average (not comprehensive)
Final Exam	=	25% of final average (not comprehensive)

The grading scale is as follows:

A	=	89.5% and up
B	=	79.5% – 89.4%
C	=	69.5% - 79.4%
F	=	69.4% and below

In lieu of a daily quiz, workbooks will be checked for completeness randomly throughout the course. The grade for the workbook will replace the daily quiz grade for that day. **Keep the workbook current and bring it to class with you every day.** Workbooks cannot be turned in late. If a student fails to turn a workbook in for a grade when requested, the student will receive a grade of "0" for the daily quiz/workbook grade.

ATTENDANCE POLICY

- Regular attendance is necessary for successful completion of this course. Therefore, it is the responsibility of the student to attend class. After 2 absences from lecture and/or lab, a **one point deduction for each additional absence** will be taken from the student's final average. **Perfect attendance** (no tardies/no absences) will result in **3-points added** to final average by raising the student's final exam score 12 points.
- Each **tardy is 0.5 absence** (2 tardies=1absence)
- **There will be no make-up for missed quiz grades.** The lowest quiz/workbook grade will be dropped.

LABORATORY:

Regular attendance is mandatory for successful completion of this course. **No Skill can be failed more than twice for successful completion of this Course.**

MAKE-UP POLICY:

A student who will not complete a Major Exam on the scheduled day must contact the instructor **before** the scheduled exam. If the absence is excused, the test must be taken **BEFORE** the next class session. A grade of ZERO for that exam will be averaged in if this policy is not followed.
