

## Folder resource

The **folder** resource is the best way to provide a single link to multiple saved files. They can be any type of file and do not have to be the same type. To insert a folder resource on a course page:

1. It is best to first be in the section of the course where you want the link to appear.
2. Then choose one of the methods shown below to add the folder resource.  
*(These choices are located at the bottom of each section in your course.)*



Once the folder resource is inserted into the section, you can [move it](#) to where you want it to appear in the section (or even to a different section).

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## Recommended settings for a folder resource



To change the settings explained on the next page, first click the **Edit** button below the link.

Name: Important MLA Resources

Visibility: Show on course page

Common module settings

Restrict access

Activity completion

Completion tracking: Do not indicate activity completion

Expect completed on

Change name of the link students see

Set completion tracking to do not indicate activity completion

Add a description that appears below the link. Best to keep description short.

Display description on course page

Best to enable this so the description will appear on the course page below the link. (If not enabled, students see the description only when they click the folder link.)

Add icon lets you browse for the files

Files

Drag and drop the files you want students to access. (If desired, you can click the Add icon to browse for the files)

Display folder contents

Inline on a course page

Show subfolders expanded

Show download folder button

Save and return to course Save and display Cancel

Choose **Inline on a course page** so students see the files below the description and don't have to click the folder link to access the files.

Click **Save and return to course** once all settings are made.

## What students see
