The Clarendon College (CC) Vera Dial Dickey Library staff welcomes all new and returning students and faculty members. The library has undertaken a couple of changes over the summer, one to the library's webpage. Please check out the webpage and familiarize yourself with the new layout, and remember to come by and ask for assistance. Library assistance is available in person at the Clarendon Campus, by phone, or by email; see the library's webpage for contact information.

The CC Library is open to students 50 hours per week for students to checkout material, read a book, study, use the online databases, get research help, and more. Student also have free access to the online catalog and databases 24/7 with the use of passwords available in their student portals. The Learning Resource Center (LRC) is available for use 67 hours per week. The LRC provides students with free access to the internet and tutoring, including 24/7 online tutoring through Brainfuse which is also found in the student portal.



The CC Library provide students with free access to SIRS and Texshare databases. The TexShare databases includes over 60 databases covering topics in History, Science, Health, Literature, and more. TexShare includes databases from EBSCO, Gale, and ProQuest. The databases includes article from academic journals, popular magazines, newspaper, and more. Both SIRS and the TexShare databases open automatically on any of our four Clarendon College campuses. Databases are accessible to students on their home and personal laptop by means of passwords found in the student portal.

All students are given a library card as part of their student ID, once the library card is registered it can be used at any HLC library. The public libraries in Clarendon, Pampa, Childress and Amarillo are HLC libraries. The Clarendon College Library has over 20,000 books in the library for checkout, as well as DVDs and magazines. The CC Library collection includes fiction, non-fiction, reference, and e-books. Student can request books from other others as well through Interlibrary Loan (ILL). Student and faculty can also request Clarendon College Library books to be sent over to the Pampa Center for checkout thought Intercampus Library Loan (ICLL). Student at the Pampa Center can register their library cards at the front office in Pampa.

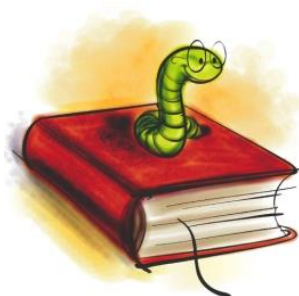
